

# Tri-Town Council to host anti-bully programs this fall

Schools throughout the state have taken the issuing of bullying head on and are all now developing anti-bullying programs of their own to align with newly created state standards. To help Tri-Town schools address this issue, the Tri-Town Council on Youth and Family services will be offering a number of assemblies this fall that address the issue of bullying.

Tri-Town Council Programs and Operations Director Lisa Teichner said they are offering the programs with the help of the Massachusetts Aggression Reduction Center. Teichner said many programs will focus on online bullying.

“Bullying just doesn’t happen person to person,” said Teichner.

Teichner said assemblies are scheduled for the Tri-Town elementary schools as well as seventh through tenth-grade students at Masconomet throughout October and November.

She said they are also sponsoring a professional development program for elementary educators that focuses on comprehensive intervention in bullying situations as well as a system-wide anti-bullying plan.

On Thursday, Nov. 4, the Tri-Town Council will also sponsor a community presentation open to the general public about bullying in local schools, which will be run by the center’s founder Dr. Elizabeth Englander.

“She was a key proponent of the Massachusetts [anti-bullying] law that is in place now,” said Teichner.

One of the first programs will take place on Oct. 13 at the Proctor Elementary School called “Boys Sense.” The program is meant for parents, guardians, and educators of elementary school boys and focuses on “practical insights and simple, yet powerful recommendations” that address the needs of young boys. This free program is scheduled for 7:30 p.m. on Oct. 13 at the Proctor Elementary School.
